General Guidelines

Glossary of terms

Materials:

Crochet Hook: Size J Yarn: Cotton yarn

Size:

- Gauge is not critical for this project
- See chart for finished sizes-Infant or Child and Adult
- These measurements are ranges only and will vary according to your crochet tension

Directions:

WASHCLOTH VERSION 1 (with double crochet)

Infant or Child: Chain 22	Adult: Chain 32
---------------------------	-----------------

Work in top loop

Row 1: Double crochet in the second stitch from the hook and continue to double crochet to complete the row.

Row 2: Turn and chain 2. Double crochet to complete the row. Last double crochet should be at the top of the chain 2 from the previous row.

Row 3+: Repeat Row 2 until the washcloth is a square.

Finishing:

Add sc border, if desired, in same or contrasting color. 3 sc in each corner.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

WASHCLOTH VERSION 2 (with single crochet)

NOTE: This version matches the stitch in the <u>crocheted bib pattern</u>. A matching bib and washcloth makes a nice gift set for a new baby and mom.

Infant or Child: Chain 26	Adult: Chain 40
----------------------------------	-----------------

Row 1: 1 sc in 4 ch from hook (counts as ch-1 sp and 1 sc), *ch 1, skip next ch, 1 sc in next ch, rep from * across. Turn.

Row 2: ch 2 (counts as ch-1 sp), *work 1 sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * across, work 1 sc in sp of turning ch. Turn.

Row 3+: Repeat Row 2 until washcloth is square.

Finishing:

If desired, add sc border in same or contrasting color. 3 sc in each corner. Fasten off and weave in ends.
