



**Caps4Kids**  
**(and matching scarf, optional)**  
(Pattern created for Knitting4Peace  
by Jia Lily Guastaferrero and adapted by Reba Quastler)

**Yarn:** One skein of **soft** medium weight yarn (3.5 oz/100g.) will make one cap & one scarf. If it's yarn you wouldn't wear, don't use it!

**Needles:** Size 9

**Pattern Notes:**

This design creates a cap that will fit kids of different ages by rolling up the brim (or not.)

- stockinette stitch = knit odd rows, purl even rows
- K2tog = knit two stitches together
- P2tog = purl two stitches together

**Pattern:**

Cast on 72 stitches

rows 1-10 - stockinette stitch (knit odd rows, purl even rows)

rows 11 & 12 - purl

row 13 - knit

rows 14-19 - [K6, P6] repeat to end

rows 20-25 - [P6, K6] repeat to end

rows 26-31 - [K6, P6] repeat to end

row 32 - purl

row 33 - [K2tog, K10] repeat to end

row 34 - [P9, P2tog] repeat to end

row 35 - [K2tog, K8] repeat to end

row 36 - [P7, P2tog] repeat to end

row 37 - [K2tog, K6] repeat to end

row 38 - [P5, P2tog] repeat to end

row 39 - [K2tog, K4] repeat to end

row 40 - [P3, P2tog] repeat to end

row 41 - [K2tog, K2] repeat to end

row 42 - [P1, P2tog] repeat to end

row 43 - [K2tog] repeat to end

row 44 - [P2tog] repeat to end

Cut yarn leaving a long tail (about 18"). With yarn needle, pull yarn through three remaining stitches then turn the hat inside-out and stitch up the seam.

**Optional matching scarf:**

Cast on 24 stitches.

Row 1 – 7: K6, P6, K6, P6

Row 8 – 14: P6, K6, P6, K6

Repeat pattern sequence until scarf reaches about 54” (the length we’ve been asked to provide to the children and teens we serve.)

Fringe is completely optional.
