KNIT COTTON BIB

NOTE: This pattern is written for 2 needles. If you like knitting in the round, join after casting on, knit the ribbing, then bind off 32 stitches and knit the body of the bib as written.

Finished size: About 7.5 inches x 8.5 inches. The circumference of the neck should be twice the width of the bib when stretched.

Gauge: 5 sts to the inch

Materials:

Needles: size 6 or size to achieve gauge

Yarn: Cotton in variegated or solid colors such as Sugar 'n Cream, Cotton Ease or Bernat Handicrafter Cotton.

Directions:

Neck of Bib

Cast on 66 sts

Work in a K1, P1 Rib for 1 inch

Bind off 15 stitches, K1 P1 to end of row (52 stitches remaining)

Bind off 15 stitches, K1 to end of row (36 stitches remaining)

Body of Bib

Continue in garter stitch until the bib measures 7 1/2 inches. K across the row
Bind off.

Finishing: Sew the back of the neck. Weave in all ends.

Variations:

1. Knit the neck in the round. After one inch, bind off 32 stitches. Continue the pattern as written.
2. Use more than one color to form stripes.
3. Knit the body of the bib in stockinette.
4. Add a favorite pattern to the body of the bib. Choose one with an element of 3.

Bless your completed project with a hug and your love. It will provide comfort, healing, and hope for the recipient.
